Start: Aysgarth Lodge Holidays



1. Wensley Waterfall

Location; **DL8 4HR 5.8 Miles** from Aysgarth

This gorgeous little waterfall isn't on any maps but is worth a visit if you're in the area. Wensley Falls is however easy to find thanks to a short permissive path that is signposted to the left of the White Rose Candle Workshop car park in Wensley.


2. Leyburn Shawl

Location; **DL8 5DG 1.4 Miles** from Wensley Waterfall

From Wensley, follow the road to Leyburn. We recommend parking your vehicle in Leyburn's centre and walking up to Leyburn Shawl.

The walk starts from the western side of the market town of Leyburn, next to Leyburn Hall. You can pick up a public footpath heading west up onto the Shawl. Here you'll find woodland sections, benches and open areas with wonderful views across the Yorkshire Dales.

There is a children's playpark at the top of the hill, perfect for keeping the kids entertained.

3. Harmby Waterfall

Location; **DL8 5PE 1.2 Miles** from Leyburn Shawl

From the Shawl, return down the hill and back to your vehicle. From Leyburn, turn left and head straight down the road. Keep going straight, past Tenants Garden Rooms on your left-hand side. When you come into Harmby, you will find a small area to park your vehicle just after the Public House on your left-hand side. You can leave your vehicle here free of charge. Cross the road and follow the path down the hill. Go down the steps and follow the signed path. Shortly, over the bridge you will discover Harmby Waterfalls on your right-hand side.

4. Forbidden Corner "The Strangest Place

In The World"

Duration; **2 - 3 Hours** Location; **DL8 4TJ 6.6 Miles** from Harmby Waterfall

From Harmby Waterfall, follow the path to return to your vehicle. From where you have parked, take the left turn opposite the Public House and follow the road through Spennithorne. At the end of the road, turn right onto the country lane and follow the road, over the bridge. At the junction, turn right at Cover Bridge. Follow the road through Middleham. When you come to the sign for The Forbidden Corner, take the right turn through the gates and follow the road up the hill and you will come to Forbidden Corner: "The Strangest Place In The World". Forbidden Corner is open from 12 pm until 6 pm (subject to early closure on quiet days but never less than 2 hours before the final admission slot).

The Forbidden Corner is a unique labyrinth of tunnels, chambers, follies and surprises created within a four-acre garden in the heart of Tupgill Park and the Yorkshire Dales.

A tourist visitor attraction unlike anywhere that you have been before, ideal for the adventurers and those young at heart!

5. Bolton Castle

Duration; 2 - 3 Hours Location; DL8 4ET 8.2 Miles from Harmby Waterfall

From Forbidden Corner, go back down the hill and take the right turn at the Gates back onto the main road. Follow the road through to Wensley and at the junction make the left turn after the Candle Shop and follow the road. Go through Redmire and follow the road. At the sign for Bolton Castle turn right and follow the road for ½ mile. Once you have turned, you should be able to spot Bolton Castle ahead. Bolton Castle offers car parking spaces; these are pay and display, but this is refunded to visitors of Bolton Castle.

Bolton Castle in Wensleydale provides a huge range of exciting things to do in Yorkshire. From family days out to

educational trips and historic tours, you will find a raft of sights, sounds and smells which bring the castle to life and make for a truly memorable trip.

Bolton Castle is one of the country's best-preserved medieval castles; originally built as one of the finest and most luxurious homes in the land, the castle bears the scars of over 600 years of fascinating history. The castle is still in the private ownership of Lord Bolton, the direct descendant of the castle's original owner Sir Richard le Scrope. Bolton Castle is open from 10 am until 5 pm.
